

Tourist VISA requirements for Brazil

- **Visa Waiver - Citizens of the following countries DO NOT need a visa to travel to Brazil for tourism purposes.**

Andorra- Argentina - Austria - Bahamas - Barbados - Belgium - Bermuda -Bolivia - Bulgaria - Chile- Colombia - Costa Rica - Czech Republic - Denmark - Ecuador- Finland - France -Germany - Great Britain - Greece - Hungary - Iceland -Ireland - Italy - Israel - Liechtenstein - Luxembourg - Malaysia - Malta - Monaco - Morocco - Namibia - Netherlands - New Zealand - Norway - Paraguay - Peru -Philippines - Poland - Portugal - San Marino - Slovenia - South Africa - South Korea - Spain - Surinam - Sweden - Switzerland - Thailand - Trinidad & Tobago - Tunis - Turkey - Uruguay - Vatican

Restricted entry: Holders of passports issued by Central African Republic, Comoros, Korea (DPR) and Taiwan will not be allowed entry to Brazil unless they are holding a Laissez-Passer issued by the Brazilian authorities.

US citizens

Passport and visa required. Tourist visas are issued within two business days if applicant submits application in person. Visas are valid for multiple entries within 5 years for a period to be determined by the consular officer, for stays of up to 90 days renewable for the same length of stay by the Brazilian Federal Police. First entry into Brazil must be within 90 days of visa issuance. Visa requires 1 application form, 1 passport size photo, and proof of onward/return transportation. There is a processing fee of \$100 for tourists. Additional \$10 fee for applications sent by mail, or by anyone other than applicant. Provide SASE for return of passport by mail. BASIC DOCUMENTATION AND APPLICATION FORM REQUIRED FOR SINGLE-ENTRY INDIVIDUAL TOURIST VISIT VISA:

- US passport that is valid for at least six months from the intended date of arrival in Brazil
- A duly filled out and signed visa application form. [Click here](#) to print visa application form .
- A photocopy of your round trip ticket to Brazil.
- One passport-sized photograph (2" x 2") in color or black and white, front view, full face, taken against a light background.
- Processing Fee - currently \$100.00

NOTE: Additional information and extra fees may be required. Be sure to check directly with the appropriate Brazilian Consulate where you will be applying for a visa to determine fees, hours of operation, amount of time needed to process the application, and the form of payment accepted. First arrival in Brazil must take place within 90 days from the date the visa was issued.

Please note that some consulate offices no longer accept applications for visas submitted by mail. Some offices will only accept visa submissions brought in by the applicant in person or by a family member/third party properly identified. Applicants who cannot apply in person will need to use the services of an independent visa service agency. Be sure to check directly with the appropriate Brazilian Consulate (list below) for your state to determine their specific requirements.

• **TOURIST VISA Requirements for Brazil**

VISA Required by all except the following:

- (a) nationals mentioned under passport exemptions below;
- (b) nationals of EU countries for touristic stays of up to 90 days;
- (c) nationals of Andorra, Bahamas, Barbados, Bolivia, Colombia, Costa Rica, Ecuador, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Monaco, Morocco, Namibia, Norway, Peru, Philippines, San Marino, Slovenia, South Africa, Surinam, Switzerland, Trinidad & Tobago, Vatican City and Venezuela for touristic stays of up to 90 days;
- (d) transit passengers continuing their journey to a third country by the same or first connecting flight, provided holding onward documentation and not leaving the airport.

Note: (a) Visa exemptions mentioned above are for touristic purposes only. All those travelling on business do need a visa (except nationals of the UK who will be granted an appropriate business visa on arrival, provided holding a return or onward ticket and proof of sufficient funds to cover duration of stay. The length of stay permitted is normally up to 90 days but can be extended to a maximum of 180 days). (b) All travellers must be in possession of onward or return tickets and sufficient funds to cover their stay.

PASSPORT

Passports valid for at least 6 months from date of entry required by all except nationals of Argentina, Chile, Paraguay and Uruguay arriving in Brazil directly from their own countries and holding a national identity card.

Required documents for visa:

Tourist/Transit:

- (a) Valid passport.
- (b) Application form.
- (c) Proof of sufficient funds to cover duration of stay.
- (d) 1 passport-size photo.
- (e) Return or onward tickets (photocopy, or letter from carrier giving flight details).
- (f) Fee (paid in cash or with a Giro slip obtainable from the Consulate).

Business:

- (a)-(f) and,
- (g) Letter from applicant's company stating the purpose and duration of the visit and confirming financial responsibility for the applicant. (Visas will not be granted if the passport expires within 6 months.)

Note: For postal applications, travellers should also submit a stamped, self-addressed envelope and a written request stating nationality, status and length of residence in the UK (where applicable) and validity of the British visa (where applicable).

Time required to issue visa:

Depends on nationality. Usually 3 (for permanent UK residents); longer by post.

<p>Costs of visa:</p>	<p>Tourist and Business: cost varies according to nationality. For permanent residents of the UK the fee is £16. Other prices, based on reciprocity, are £24 (for nationals of Korea (Rep of), Mexico and Poland); £28 (for nationals of Australia); £32 (for nationals of Canada and Nigeria); £36 (for nationals of the USA); and £40 (for nationals of Japan and Russian Federation). Transit: contact the Consulate for details of cost.</p> <p>Note: Postal applications cost an additional £8.</p>
<p>Validity of visa:</p>	<p>90 days from date of issue. Tourist visas can be used for multiple entry within the period of validity. For an extension of the 3-month Tourist visa, apply in Brazil.</p>
<p>Comment:</p>	<p>Persons under 18 years of age when not accompanied by both parents must have a birth certificate (an original or photocopy). This must be in Portuguese, English, Spanish or French, otherwise an official translation must be presented as well. When travelling alone or with one parent, a declaration from the absent parent(s) must be presented authorising the journey and giving the name and address of the person in Brazil who will be responsible for the minor.
